

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were: Shelly Haas, Deb Meyers, Daryl Sherraden, Ryan Weltmer, and James Balthazor.

All present stood for the flag salute.

Deb Meyers moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from September 18, 2018. Haas seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Balthazor moved to pay bills in the amount of \$77,629.76. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Two residential utility accounts that had large leaks were discussed. After discussion:

- Sherraden moved to adjust the billing for utility account numbers 570002 and 350002 to reflect the last six months of average water use. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Compliance Officer Mandy Bice reported:

- Presented two bids from Collins Refuse to the Council for the demolition of blighted properties.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to accept the bids for demolition of 207 Plainville Avenue in the amount of \$4,500.00 and 510 South Kansas in the amount of \$3,375.00. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Overdue bills for Ravason LLC and Rooks County Holdings have not been paid or have had any arrangements made for payment. The Council has no objection to having the amounts sent to Rooks County for assessment to property.
- The City office has always been open the Friday after Thanksgiving with very little or no customers. This year Christmas Eve will fall on Monday. The employees usually work half a day on Christmas Eve. Would the Council consider making the Friday after Thanksgiving a permanent holiday day and consider allowing a full day for Christmas Eve in 2018.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to make the Friday after Thanksgiving a permanent City holiday and allow a full day off for Christmas Eve 2018. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- The hold items listed on the agenda should be reviewed.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to remove the Dispatch Fees from the agenda's hold items. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Weltmer, Mesecher and Deb Meyers attended a Strategic Doing meeting on the 19th of September. Ideas about tax rebates were brought forward and it was asked that the government entities in the county consider the plan.

Balthazor is still negotiating prices for signs.

Balthazor moved to adjourn the meeting. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 7:57 PM.
