

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Kelli Hansen presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were: Quentin Meyers, Alan Dinkel, Shelly Haas, Daryl Sherraden, and Deb Meyers.

All present stood for the flag salute.

Sherraden moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from September 5, 2017. Haas seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Dinkel moved to pay bills in the amount of \$55,352.93. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Tom Carpenter with Mapes & Miller LLP presented and reviewed the 2016 Audit with a clean opinion by the firm.

- Dinkel moved to accept the 2016 Audit as presented by Mapes & Miller LLP. Quentin Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mayor Hansen suggested the name of Deb Turnbull to fill the vacant seat on the Library Board.

- Quentin Meyers moved to approve the appointment of Deb Turnbull for the vacant Library Board seat. Haas seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The continuation of the public hearing started on September 5, 2017 at 7:00 PM to discuss the properties listed in Resolution 203 was opened at 7:30 PM. After discussion, the public meeting was closed at 7:44 PM.

- Sherraden moved to accept and approve Resolution 204 regarding certain unsafe structures within the City of Plainville. Quentin Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mayor Kelli Hansen reported:

- The League of Kansas Municipalities annual conference was very informative.
- The Strategic Doing Training session held on September 12<sup>th</sup> was well received.
- The Plainville Ambassadors Club (PAC) would like to donate the cost of having Blaine's Electric install lighting at the Veterans Memorial.
  - ◆ Sherraden moved to accept and allow Blaine's Electric to install lighting at the Veteran's Memorial for the price of \$5,450.00 contingent upon first receiving PAC's donation in the same amount.


Public Works Supervisor Jerry Hageman reported:

- ◆ Sherraden moved to allow the purchase of the back blade from Farm Implement for \$2,850.00. Quentin Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Quentin Meyers informed the Council that the generator at the fire station needs repaired or replaced. The cost of repair would be approximately \$1,300.00. They department will use a backup generator until the cost of a replacement can be determined.
